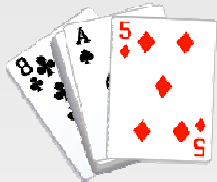

APALA HISTORY

In 1992, over 500 Asian Pacific American (APA) labor activists from around the country gathered in Washington D.C. for the founding convention of the Asian Pacific American Labor Alliance, AFL-CIO.

Prior to the founding convention several local APA labor groups were formed. In 1990, APA labor activists approached the AFL-CIO with a historic proposal to form a national Asian Pacific American labor group. As a result, in 1991, the AFL-CIO Executive Council established a committee to explore the formation of a national APA labor group.

The stated goals of APALA were to create an organization which would educate APA workers; promote political education and voter registration programs among APAs; and promote training, empowerment, and leadership of APAs within the labor movement and APA community. APALA further set out to defend and advocate for the civil and human rights of APAs, immigrants and people of color and to develop ties within international labor organizations, especially in Asia and the Pacific.
